
WHEREAS, **Peggy Gehl**, Senior Judge, has been issued such a blanket order by the Supreme Court of Florida;


I, JORGE LABARGA, under authority vested in me as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Florida, under article V, section 2 of the Constitution of Florida, the rules of this Court promulgated thereunder and pursuant to the opinion of this Court in the case styled In Re: Report and Recommendations of the Committee on the Appointment and Assignment of Senior Judges, 847 So. 2d 415 (Fla. 2003), and the recommendations of the Senior Judge Review Board, do hereby assign and designate THE HONORABLE PEGGY GEHL for statewide judicial service, effective October 1, 2017, and which shall expire on September 30, 2018. JUDGE GEHL is authorized to hear, conduct, try, and determine the causes which shall be presented to the judge as a temporary judge of any county and circuit court in the State of Florida upon approval by the chief judge of that court and thereafter to dispose of all matters considered by the judge, including issues of fees and costs arising out of said causes, but excluding other matters subsequently raised that are collateral to said causes, during the term of this order. JUDGE GEHL, under and by virtue of the authority hereof, is hereby vested with all powers and prerogatives conferred by the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida upon a judge of the court to which the judge is assigned.
